
This year, you have the opportunity to help build a bridge to wellbeing, to connect children, families, and residents with care by investing in addressing situations just like Becky's.

The Mobile Crisis Assessment Team (MCAT) is an award winning service that provides essential supports to those facing a mental health crisis. The team provides life-saving interventions and connects individuals with continued care solutions for wellbeing.

RECOVERY SUPPORT PROGRAM FOR MENTAL HEALTH

PROS helps those living with a mental health diagnosis learn life skills to thrive and live life to its fullest potential. Individuals get to work toward different goal areas, integrating rehabilitation, treatment, and support services. Individuals work on coping skills, employment support, creative arts, medication management, and more.

CLUBHOUSES YOUTH DROP IN CENTER AND RECOVERY PROGRAMS

The Clubhouses provide a drop in center for the youth and young adults to participate in activities that build learning and capabilities. They conduct a live radio broadcast, develop art, music and dance projects, participate in community events, and have even worked to develop short movies. Harm Reduction is also an important aspect with the youth providing live saving resources & trainings, such as on Naloxone to the community.
